Dear Candlelight Ranch Supporter,

Welcome to our first ever annual report! We are so excited to share our 2022 impact with each of you as we continue to serve our mission of providing nature-based and educational programs to children and families of all abilities and needs to learn, explore, and heal. 2022 was a return to normal at Candlelight Ranch. We were thrilled to welcome so many program partners, groups, and families this year. We delivered over 16,000 hours of direct programming to over 1,791 children and their families, providing a day of fun, healing, learning, and respite in nature.


We are proud to report on our programmatic successes, strengthening engagement, and learning while helping children and families achieve inclusion in outdoor based programming otherwise inaccessible to them due to financial, emotional, or physical disadvantages. 100% of surveyed caregivers expressed that their experience with Candlelight Ranch positively affected them and their family, and that they were "very likely" to increase their families time spent in nature. Families reported that the greatest benefit they received from their experience was family bonding - "a day spent together", followed by stepping outside their comfort zone - "trying something new" and "fun in nature". Throughout 2022 Candlelight Ranch strengthened existing relationships with Central Texas schools and community organizations with 100% of partner organizations reporting that they were "extremely satisfied" with their visit and that they were able to meet their unique needs and goals.

We are deeply grateful for your support and know that together, we are healing hearts and creating joy for thousands of Central Texans each year. - Stress reduction




# Outdoor Explorers Impact


